## Let's Make It: (lassic Lemonade

Lemonade is especially refreshing in the summer months. There's just nothing quite like the perfect mix of ripe lemons, sugar, and ice-cold water. Ask an adult to help you make this easy lemonade recipe for your next picnic, playdate, or lemonade stand.

#### **INGREDIENTS:**

- 1<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cups granulated sugar
- 1 cup water
- 9 medium lemons
- 7 cups ice-cold water
- Ice cubes as needed

#### **DIRECTIONS:**

- 1. Gather the ingredients.
- 2. Over medium-high heat, combine 1 cup of water and sugar in a small saucepan. Stir to dissolve while the mixture comes to a boil. Set aside to cool—this becomes the simple syrup.
- 3. Cut the lemons in half and squeeze into a measuring cup. Continue juicing until you have 1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cups of fresh juice. Keep the pulp but discard the seeds.
- **4.** Pour 7 cups of ice-cold water into a pitcher. Stir in lemon juice and simple syrup to taste. Add ice cubes for serving.

PENNY (1¢):

Abraham Lincoln served as America's 16<sup>th</sup> president during the Civil War. The first Lincoln penny was produced (minted) in 1909 in honor of his 100<sup>th</sup> birthday.

#### NICKEL (5¢): Thomas Jefferson

was America's third president and co-author of the Declaration of Independence.

#### DIME (10¢):

Franklin D. Roosevelt, our 32<sup>nd</sup> president, was known for leading the country through the Great Depression and World War II.

## QUARTER (25¢):

George Washington was our nation's first president. The U.S. Mint first produced the Washington quarter in 1932 to celebrate the 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary of his birth.
